Job Title: Queen Conch Restoration Project

Location: Marathon and Long Key, FL

Summary of Position:

Interns help to increase conch populations by helping to transplant wild non-spawning conch from nearshore locations into areas near the reef where the conch will begin to spawn. The interns locate and tag wild adult conchs and release them in these locations and then help monitor their reproductive activity. Additionally, interns collect plankton to determine the origins of the conch larvae that settle in Florida.
